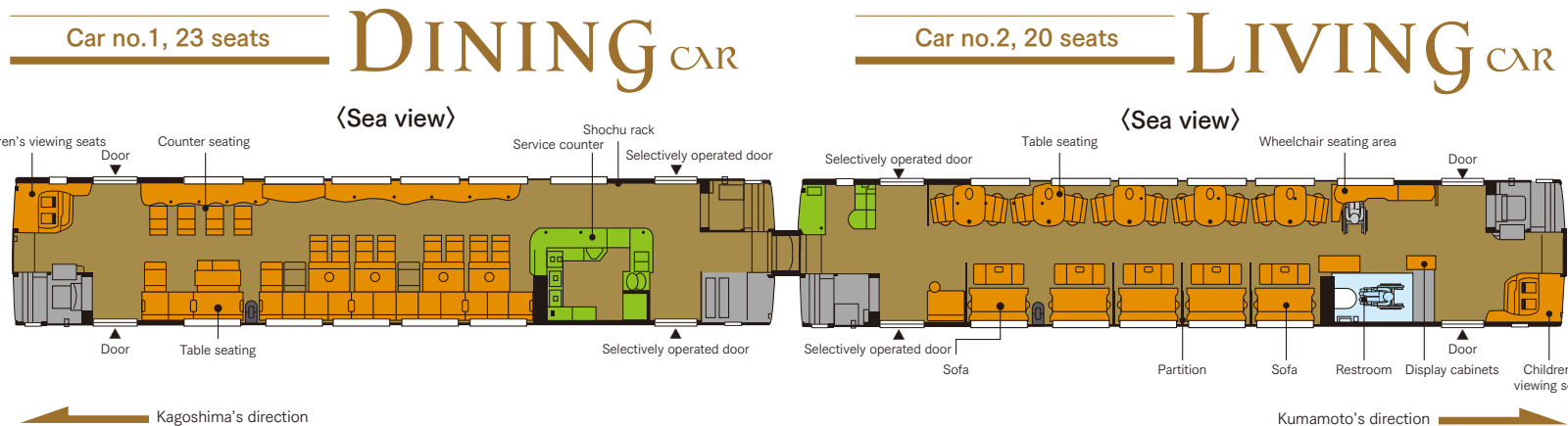
Marché

## Guide to Sightseeing in Kumamoto

### Tsunagi



**Tatsu Butsu**  
Amidst the tranquil forest stands a collection of golden Buddha statues perched on live trees. The location has been gaining attention as an energy vortex.

Enjoy seasonal gastronomy and arts

In addition to the Tsunagi Art Museum, a 10-minute walk from Tsunagi Station, the town boasts numerous sculptures on display that will pique your intellectual curiosity. Additionally, you can visit the southernmost sake brewery in Japan.

### Yatsushiro



**Yatsushiro Myoken Festival**  
(Held annually on 23 November)  
One of the three major festivals in Kyushu is listed as a UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage. At Yatsushiro Shrine, visitors can see displays of turtle serpents and other objects.



**Muratsu House**  
This townhouse dates back to 1862 and boasts a stunning contrast between its black roof tiles and white plasterwork.

### Ashikita

**Roller luge**  
(Ashikita Kaihin Sogo Park)  
Experience traditional fishing by sailing without a motor and using the wind and tides to pull nets. Make a reservation to arrange this unique experience.



**Utase boat**  
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**Eco Park Minamata**  
The rose garden hosts biannual festivals in spring and autumn, showcasing 5,000 roses of 800 varieties.

**Otachimisaki Onsen Center**  
The hot spring center is situated on a hill in Cape Omitschi. Guests can enjoy the breathtaking evening views of the Shiranui Sea from the open-air baths.

### Izumi



**Izumi Museum of History**  
The museum displays armor, helmets, and weapons.



**Samurai residences**  
In the town, you can see stone walls, hedgerows, and gates of the samurai houses that date back to around 400 years ago.

### Akune



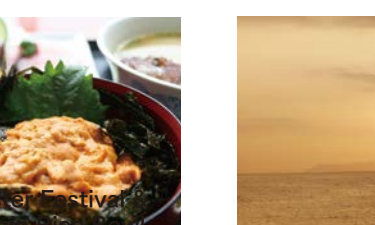
**Akuneya at Akune Station**

### Satsuma-Sendai



**Izumi Crane Observation Center**  
You can get a close view of the ecology of cranes as a visitor. The observation is open from 1 Nov to the 2nd Sunday of March the following year, from 9am to 5pm. The admission fee for adults is 220 yen.

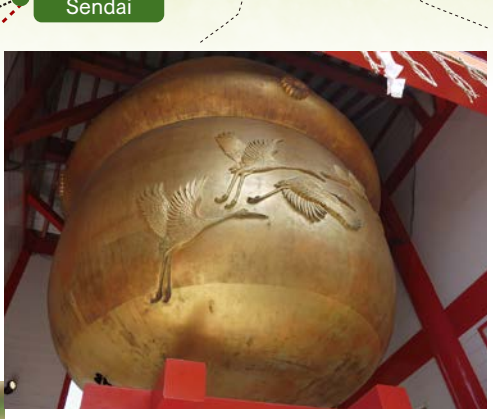
**Hakozaki Hachiman Shrine**

**Izumi City Crane Museum Crane Park Izumi**  
Visit Japan's sole crane museum, open from 9am to 5pm. It is closed every Monday from April to October but open every Monday from November to March.



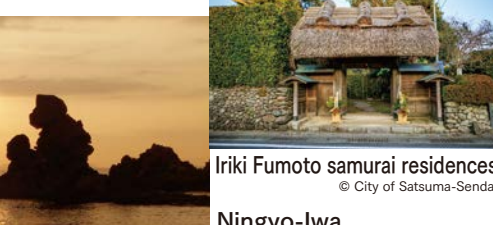
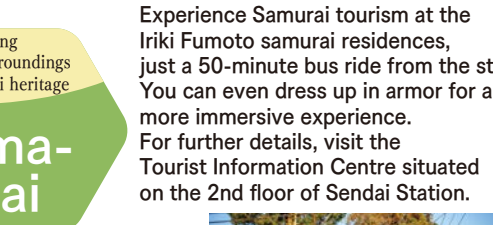
