




The hot spring center is situated on a hill in Cape Omitachi. Guests can enjoy the breathtaking evening views of the Shiranui Sea from the open-air baths.




Crane Park Izumi isit Japan's sole crane museum

The town by the port has an abundance of fresh fish and seafood. You can see breathtaking sunsets over the East China Sea in the evening.








Akuneya at Akune Station
